## Council Reports

<u>Council President Vasquez:</u> She attended the Library Board meeting. They moved their fundraiser to April. She attended a meeting in Wharton today that was run by Morris County to help businesses with making applications to the County's small business grant program. It was a good meeting; she was able to assist 2 local businesses with their applications.

<u>Councilman Binkoski</u>: At this point in the winter, we are good with our stockpile of salt. Hopefully we won't need to use too much more. He brought up an idea about looking into having people who work for the town needing to go to other towns to get inspections, similar to the requirement for elected officials to do so. After some discussion, it was decided that this isn't necessary.

<u>Councilwoman Hayes:</u> The Finance Committee met to go over the 2022 budgets, which are looking good.

<u>Councilman Norton</u>: He attended a meeting on 2/9 with the various sports programs in town along with DPW Director Mr. Hutchins, DPW Foreman Mr. Rolph, and Mr. Kovalcik. It was a very productive and good meeting and they were able to go over a lot of items.

## Councilwoman Wickenheisser: No report.

<u>Councilman Yeager:</u> The Chief looked into the speed signs that were discussed at the last meeting. They are approximately \$5000 each. Mr. Hutchins gave some more information about the sign options. It was decided to purchase a few if there is room in the budget. The Fire Department received 10 calls last month.

<u>Mayor Chegwidden's Report</u>: The Police have been continuing to address the complaints about speeding, etc. and have been writing a lot of tickets throughout town. There is an amendment coming to the Redevelopment Plan for the LE Carpenter Site. There should be a resolution referring the amendment to the Planning Board for review at our next meeting.
