He attended the Morris County League of Municipalities dinner. He moderated the NJLM seminar for newly elected officials. He attended the Planning Board meeting and explained 170 N. Main Street was granted another extension. He and Mr. Hutchins met with the developer of Morris Woods and discussed an alternative entrance to the old water tower at Robert Street Park. The contractor offered to put a road in to the tower, through their parking lot. This access will make the rehabilitation on the tower easier.

He will be publishing a chart in the Mayor's Newsletter showing where the tax dollars go and how a PILOT works. We will also have the Tax Assessor at our meeting on March 25th to give a presentation on how the process works.
